Winner (community less than 20,000 population): District of Kitimat and Haisla Nation for *CEDI Partnership*


Winner (community more than 20,000 population): City of Victoria for *South Island Indigenous Business Directory*

Community Resiliency Award

This category includes submissions for programs, activities, and projects that represent a successful recovery initiative from natural and man-made disasters, including the loss of a major employer, housing and labour shortages as well as submissions that represent replicable measures undertaken to promote long term resiliency and/or sustainability from future disasters.

Chair's Award

The Chair's Award is presented annually to recognize a member of BCEDA who has made a significant contribution towards the profession of economic development as well as the function, goals and/or mandate of the BC Economic Development Association.
